Scripture Reading: Isaiah 40:21-31 (Inclusive Bible)

(God gives strength to the weary and empowers the powerless)

Did you not know? Have you not heard?

Was it not told to you from the beginning?

Have you not understood since the earth was founded?

YHWH sits above the vaulted roof of the world, and its inhabitants look
like grasshoppers!

God stretches out the skies like a curtain, and spreads them out like a
tent for mortals to live under!

God reduces the privileged to nothing and throws the rulers of the earth
into chaos.

No sooner are they planted, no sooner are they sown, no sooner do

they take root on earth, than God blows on them and they wither; and a
storm wind sweeps them away like chaff.

"To whom can you liken me? Who is my equal?" Says the Holy One.

Lift up your eyes and ask yourself who made these stars, if not the One
who drills them like an army, calling each by name?

Because God is so great in strength, so mighty in power, not a single one
is missing.

How can you say, tribe of Leah and Rachel and Jacob,

"My destiny is hidden from YHWH, my rights are ignored by my God?"

Do you not know? Have you not heard?

YHWH is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth.

This God does not faint or grow weary; with a depth of understanding
that is unsearchable.

they soar on eagles' wings,

they run and don't get weary,

they walk and never tire.

Responsive Reading: Psalm 147:2-11

(a paraphrase - James Taylor- *Everyday Psalms*)

(Not impressed by appearances)

We are the refugees.

Our homes and our spirits have been destroyed.

Across the earth we have fled seeking asylum.

God gathered us together, and gave us a second chance.

We are the sick, the infirm, the elderly.

God gave us nurses, and medicines,

and medicare to cover the costs that would have crushed us.

We are the students, the scientists, the scholars.

The more we explore our universe,

the more the mysteries we encounter fill us with awe.

We are the poor, the oppressed,

the people at the bottom of the pile.

We see the powerful and mighty come tumbling down,

betrayed by their own corruption.

How can you see all this, and doubt the power of God?

**If God can make the rain fall, the grass grow,
the rivers run, and the sun shine,
if God can balance the needs of nature
so that both lion and lamb can live,
then surely God can also affect human affairs.**

We are not well-dressed, or privileged;
we are not wealthy or important.

**But God does not judge by appearances
God is not impressed by titles and positions,
nor influenced by body-building and cosmetic beauty.
In the eyes of God, a pauper matters as much as a priest,
a person on welfare as much as a president.**

What matters is how well we hear God,
and how much we care for each other.

Scripture Reading: 1 Corinthians 9:16-23

(I have become all things to all people)

Not that I do boast about preaching the Gospel; I am under compulsion and have no choice. I am ruined if I do not preach the Gospel! If I do it willingly, I have my reward; if unwillingly, I am nonetheless entrusted with a charge. What then is my reward? It is simply this: that when preaching, I offer the Gospel free of charge and do not assert the authority the Gospel gives me. Although I am not bound to anyone, I put myself into the service of all so as to win over as many as possible.

To the Jews I became even more Jewish, to win over the Jewish people; even though I am not subject to the Law, I made myself subject to the Law, to win those who are subject to the Law. To those who have no law, I was free of the Law, too - though not free from God's Law, being subject to the Law of Christ - to win those who have no law. To the weak I became weak to win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that I might save at least some of them. In fact, I do all that I do for the sake of the Gospel in the hope of having a share in its blessings.
