A Calling to Mind:

Sacrament of Baptism

Statement of Purpose:

From the beginning of time, people have come before God and their community to celebrate the miracle of life, and to give thanks to God for the special gift that our children are to us. That is what we do in our sacrament of baptism. We give thanks to God, we express our own faith in God as central to our lives, and we commit ourselves afresh to the nurturing of our children in the Christian church.

Scripture: Galatians 3:27-29 (The Inclusive Bible:
The First Egalitarian Translation)

Each one of you is a child of God because of your faith in Christ Jesus. All of you who have been baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. In Christ there is no Jew or Greek, slave or free, male or female. All are one in Christ Jesus. Furthermore, if you belong to Christ, you are the offspring of Abraham, which means you inherit all that was promised.

Profession of faith by the parents:

You have brought your child here for baptism. In baptism we are joined to the Christian family through the sign and seal of God's eternal love. Do you believe in God and God's love?

Yes, I do so believe.

Scripture Reading: Psalm 139: 1-18 (Inclusive Bible-First Egalitarian Edition)
(God knew us before we were born)

YHWH you've searched me, and you know me. You know if I am standing or sitting, you read my thoughts from far away. Whether I walk or lie down, you are watching; you are intimate with all of my ways. A word is not even on my tongue, YHWH, before you know what it is: you hem me in, before and behind, shielding me with your hand. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, a height my mind cannot reach!

Where could I run from your Spirit? Where could I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you're there; if I make my bed in Death, you're already there. I could fly away with wings made of dawn, or make my home on the far side of the sea, but even there your hand will guide me, your mighty hand holding me fast. If I say, "The darkness will hide me, and night will be my only light," even darkness won't be dark to you; the night will shine like the day - darkness and light are the same to you.
