Scripture:

Amos 8:1-12 (the Inclusive Bible-The First Egalitarian Edition)

(The prophet Amos speaks)

This is what the Sovereign YHWH showed me: a basket of ripe figs.

God said, "What do you see Amos?" "A basket of ripe figs," I replied.

Then YHWH said to me: "The time is ripe for my people, Israel. I will no longer tolerate their atrocities. The singers in the Temple will wail that day: 'So many corpses scattered everywhere. Hush!'" --It is the Sovereign YHWH who speaks.

Listen to this, you who live off the poor of the land, you who say, "If only the New Moon were over so we could sell our grain," and, "When Sabbath is over, we will sell our wheat charging higher prices for smaller portions, thus tilting the scales in our favour. That way, we can buy the poor for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals - and even make a

profit on the chaff of the wheat!" YHWH swears by the pride of Jacob, I will never forget a single thing you have done."

Will not the land tremble because of this, and all who dwell in it mourn? Will the land not rise up like the Nile, rising and sinking like the river of Egypt?

"That day - it is the Sovereign YHWH who speaks - I will make the sun set at noon, and darken the earth in broad daylight. I will turn your feasts into funerals and all your happy songs into dirges. I will have your loins all in sackcloth, your heads all shaved. I will make the land mourn as one would mourn for a dead child - all of this on that bitter day!

The time is come - it is the Sovereign YHWH who speaks - when I will send famine on the land: not a famine of bread or thirst for water, but a famine of not hearing the words of YHWH.

People will stagger from sea to sea and wander from north to east seeking revelation from YHWH, but will not find it.

Responsive Reading: Psalm 52 (from *Everyday Psalms*, by James Taylor)
(Moral bankruptcy)

You boast about beating your competitors;

you brag about evading taxes;

you use other people's money for leveraged financing.

You think you're worth millions.

But everything you do exposes your moral bankruptcy.

You'd rather lord it over your neighbours than love them;
you'd rather knife your employees than nurture them.

You're a bundle of malevolent reflexes.

Someday, you will get what you deserve.

your children will despise you,

your colleagues will avoid you.

Your empires will come crashing down around your shattered ego.

Even those you exploited will laugh at you.

They'll say, "How the mighty are fallen!"

They'll laugh, "The bigger you are, the harder you fall!"

I'm not powerful or successful.

I'm a child compared to you.

But I ride my roller coasters in the park, not in the stock market.

I'd rather hold a hand than a meeting.

What I do, I do for God.

If any credit is due, I give it to God.

And God frees me to enjoy the goodness of living.

Reflection: Consequences

(Jesus visits Mary and Martha)

As they travelled, Jesus entered a village where a woman named Martha welcomed him to her home. She had a sister named Mary, who seated herself at Jesus' feet and listened to his words.

Martha, who was busy with all the details of hospitality, came to Jesus and said, "Rabbi, don't you care that my sister has left me all alone to do the household tasks? Tell her to help me!"

Jesus replied, "Martha, Martha! You're anxious and upset about so many things, but only a few things are necessary - really only one. Mary has chosen the better part, and she won't be deprived of it."

Reflection: Balance

Scripture: Colossians 1:15-28 (the Inclusive Bible-The First Egalitarian Edition)

(Christ is the image of the unseen God)

Christ is the image of the unseen God and the firstborn of all creation, for in Christ were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and invisible, Thrones, Dominations, Sovereignities, Powers - all things were created through Christ and for Christ.

Before anything was created, Christ existed, and all things hold together in Christ. The church is the body; Christ is its head. Christ is the Beginning, the firstborn from the dead, and so Christ is first in every way. God wanted all perfection to be found in Christ, and all things to be reconciled to God through Christ - everything in heaven and everything on earth - when Christ made peace by dying on the cross.

At one time, you were alienated from God by the way you thought and the evil things you did. But now you are reconciled in Christ's mortal body through death, so that you can now stand before God holy, pure and blameless- provided you persevere and stand firm on the solid base of your faith. Never let yourselves drift away from the hope promised by the Good News that you have heard, which even now is being preached to the whole human race, and for which I, Paul was made a minister.

Even now I find my joy in the suffering I endure for you. In my own body I fill up what is lacking in the sufferings of Jesus, for the sake of Christ's body, the church. I became a minister of this church through the commission God gave me, to preach among you the word in its fullness - that mystery hidden from ages and generations past, but now revealed to God's holy ones. God's will was to make known to them the priceless glory which this mystery brings to the nations - the mystery of Christ in you, the hope of glory. This is the Christ we proclaim while we admonish everyone and teach them in the full measure of wisdom, hoping to make everyone complete in our saviour.
