Scripture: Job 39:1-8, 26-30 (*The Inclusive Bible*)

(Is it your wisdom that directs nature?)

Do you know in what season the mountain goats give birth? Have you ever watched a red deer in labour? Do you know their gestation periods and their time of birth, when they crouch down to bring forth their

young and get rid of their labour pains? Do you know how their young grow strong, how they thrive in the open, grow to maturity, then leave and never return?

Who freed the wild donkey, and removed the bridle from its head? I gave it the desert to roam in, and the salt flats to dwell in. It rejects the noisy city; it has no driver to give it orders. It ranges over mountains for a pasture, and seeks out green places.

Are you and your wisdom why the soaring hawk spreads its wings and heads south? Does the eagle fly aloft at your word to make its nest so high? It spends its nights amid rocks and cliffs, with the pinnacle of a peak as its stronghold. From this view it searches for its prey, with eyes that see from afar. It feeds its young on blood; where carrion is found, there it is.

Dear friends in Corinth,

We all like to have things our own way. Each of us would like to be boss over everybody else. But we are a Christian church. We must work together if we want to live in God's way.

Think of your church as if it is a person's body. The whole church body should live in God's way. Not just some parts of it.

Would your foot say, "Because I am not a hand, I don't belong to the body"? That's silly.

Would your ear say, "Because I am not an eye, I don't belong to the body"? That's silly.

If your whole body were an eye, how would you hear things? If your whole body were an ear, how would you smell things?

Your eye can't say to your hand, "I don't need you." That's silly.

Your head can't say to your feet, "I don't need you." That's silly.

God has put all the parts of our body together so that they help each other. Everything is part of one body.

If part of your body is hurting, then you feel bad all over.

If part of your body is happy, you feel good all over.

The church is like the body of Christ. Each one of us is like the hands, or feet, or eyes, or ears of that body.

Each one of us can do different things. Some people can sing. Others can listen. A few can run fast. Some people can work hard. Others can draw nice pictures. Some people can think about important things.

Each one of us is important. We are Christ's body and we are all needed. Living in God's way means working together as the church.
