Scripture: Mark 1:1-8 *(The Inclusive Bible: the First Egalitarian Translation)*

(The preaching of John the Baptizer)

Here begins the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God: as it was written in Isaiah the prophet: "I send my messenger before you to prepare your way, a herald's voice in the desert, crying, 'Make ready the way of our God. Clear a straight path.'"

And so John the Baptizer appeared in the desert, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. The whole Judean

countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to John and were baptized by him in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins.

John was clothed in camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist, and he ate nothing but grasshoppers and wild honey. In the course of his preaching, John said, "One more powerful than I is to come after me. I am not fit to stoop and untie his sandal straps, I have baptized you with water, but the One to come will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

Scripture: Isaiah 40:1-11 (*New Revised Standard Version*)

(Comfort, O comfort my people)

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from God's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of God, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of God shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of God has spoken."

A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades when the breath of God blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever.

Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!"

YHWH, O Sovereign One, you come with power, and rule with a strong arm! You bring your reward with you, and your recompense comes before you. Like a shepherd you feed your flock, gathering the lambs and holding them close, and leading the mother ewes with gentleness.
