Scripture: 1 Samuel 3:1-10 (*Inclusive Bible - The First Egalitarian Edition*)

(*God calls Samuel*)

Now young Samuel was in the service of YHWH under Eli. In those days, the voice of YHWH was rarely heard - prophesy was uncommon. One night Eli, whose eyes had grown so weak that he could no longer see, was sleeping on his bed. The lamp of God had not gone out, and Samuel was sleeping in the Tent of Meeting, near the Ark of the Covenant.

Then YHWH called to Samuel. Samuel answered, "Here I am!" And ran to Eli saying, "You called. Here I am!"

Eli said, "I didn't call you. Now go back to sleep." He went back to sleep.

A second time, YHWH called Samuel, and he got up and went to Eli. "Here I am!" Samuel said, "You called me."

Eli repeated, "I did not call you. Go back to sleep."

At that time Samuel had not yet encountered YHWH, and the word of YHWH had not yet been revealed to him.

YHWH called Samuel a third time, and Samuel got up, went to Eli, and said once more, "Here I am. You called me."

Then Eli realized that YHWH was calling the boy. so he said to Samuel, "Go back and go to sleep, and if you are called again, say, 'Speak, YHWH, for your servant is listening.'" so Samuel went back to sleep.

And YHWH called, "Samuel! Samuel!"

And Samuel replied, "Yes, YHWH, I am listening."

(*Paul explains Spiritual wisdom*)

As for myself, sisters and brothers, when I came to you I did not come proclaiming God's testimony with any particular eloquence or wisdom. No, I determined that while I was with you I would know nothing but Jesus Christ - Christ crucified. When I came among you, it was in weakness and fear, and with much trepidation. My message and my preaching did not rest on philosophical arguments, but on the convincing power of the Spirit. As a consequence, your faith rests not on human wisdom, but on the power of God.

Still, there is a certain wisdom which we express among the spiritually mature. It is not a wisdom of this age, however, nor of the rulers of this age, who are headed for destruction. No, what we utter is God's wisdom: a mysterious, hidden wisdom. God planned it before all ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age knew the mystery; if they had known it, they would never have crucified the Sovereign of Glory. Of this wisdom it is written,

"Eye has not seen, ear has not heard,

nor has it so much as dawned on anyone

what God has prepared for those who love God."

Yet God has revealed this wisdom to us through the Holy Spirit. She searches out all things, even the deep things of God. After all, no one knows one's thoughts except one's own inner spirit; by the same token, no one knows God's thoughts except God's Spirit. We haven't received

the spirit of the world but the Spirit of God, so that we can understand what God has freely given us. And this is precisely what we talk about, not using words taught us by human wisdom, but words taught by the Spirit, expressing spiritual thoughts in spiritual words.

People without the Spirit do not accept what the Spirit of God teaches. Such teachings seem like foolishness to them because they can't understand them; such things must be spiritually discerned. Spiritual people, on the other hand, can discern all things, though they themselves can be discerned by no one - for, "Who understands the mind of the Most High? Who would give instruction to God?" We, however, have the mind of Christ.
