Lighting of the Christ Candle:

For the past four Sundays, we have lit the Advent candles,

one by one, as we traveled toward this night.

The first candle was the candle of hope. *(1st candle is lit)*

Hope leads us to pray for peace,

acting peacefully to cultivate harmony in all our relations.

The second candle was the candle of peace. *(2nd candle is lit)*

Peace transforms into joyful celebration:

walls torn down, chasms filled,

barriers leveled, valleys bridged.

The third candle was the candle of joy. *(3rd candle (pink) is lit)*

Joy inspires us to dance with abandon.

Joy embraced fosters love that makes all things new.

The fourth candle was the candle of love. *(4th candle is lit)*

The deep meaning of love shared shows us the Christ.

We now light the Christ candle, in celebration of God's most precious gift to us:

A fragile baby who brings hope, peace, joy, and love into the world.

And into the hearts and minds of each one of us. (*The Christ candle is lit*)

ALL: The Christ comes, still completely vulnerable, yet filled with promise.

Introduction to Scripture:

Many, many years before Jesus was born, there lived a prophet called Isaiah. Isaiah was sad about the kings and leaders in his time who had forgotten God's way. Isaiah dreamed of a time when God would send a new leader, a king who would be fair and loving and would show people God's way once again. He described the coming of this new leader in this way:

Scripture: Isaiah 9:2,6-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness - on them a light has shined. For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore.

Scripture: Luke 2:1-6

In those days, Caesar Augustus published a decree ordering a census of the whole Roman world. This first census took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All the people were instructed to go back to the towns of their birth to register. And so Joseph went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to "the city of David" - Bethlehem, in Judea, because Joseph was of the house and lineage of David, he went to register with Mary, his espoused wife, who was pregnant.

While they were there, the time came for her delivery. She gave birth to her firstborn, a son; she put him in a simple cloth wrapped like a receiving blanket, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them at the inn.

Today in David's city, a saviour - the Messiah - has been born to you. Let this be a sign to you: you will find an infant wrapped in a simple cloth, lying in a manger."

"Glory to God in high heaven! And on earth, peace to those on whom God's favour rests."
