Scripture: Matthew 5:38-48 (*The Inclusive Bible, The First Egalitarian Translation*) (Love your enemies)

"You've heard the commandment, an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' But I tell you, offer no resistance whatsoever when you're confronted with violence. When someone strikes you on the right cheek, turn and offer the other. If anyone wants to sue you for your shirt, hand over your coat as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go two miles. Give to those who beg from you. And don't turn your back on those who want to borrow from you.

"You have heard it said, 'Love your neighbour - but hate your enemy.' but I tell you, love your enemies and pray for your persecutors. This will prove that you are children of God. For God makes the sun rise on the bad and good alike; God's rain falls on the just and the unjust. If you love those who love you, what merit is there in that? Don't tax collectors do as much? And if you greet only your sisters and brothers, what is so praiseworthy about that? Don't Gentiles do as much? Therefore be perfect, as Abba God in heaven is perfect.

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 3:10-11, 16-23 (*The Inclusive Bible, The First Egalitarian Translation*) (You are God's temple)

By the Grace God gave me, I acted as a wise architect and laid the foundation. Some-one else is doing the building. But each of you doing the building must do it carefully. For no one can lay a foundation other than the one already in place - Jesus Christ.

Aren't you aware that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If you destroy God's temple, God will destroy you - for the temple of God is holy, and you are that temple.

Don't delude yourselves. Any who think themselves wise in a worldly way had better become fools. In that way you will really be wise, for the wisdom of this world is absurdity with God as scripture says. "God knows how empty are the thoughts of the wise," and again, "God is not convinced by the arguments of the

wise." So there is nothing to boast about in anything human, whether it be Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future - all these are yours, and you belong to Christ, and Christ belongs to God."

Scripture: Matthew 6:24-34 (The Inclusive Bible, The First Egalitarian

Translation) (God and possessions)

"No one can serve two superiors. You will either hate one and love the other, or be attentive to one and despise the other. You cannot give yourself to God and Money. That's why I tell you not to worry about your livelihood, what you are to eat or drink or use for clothing. Isn't life more than just food? Isn't the body more than just clothes?

Look at the birds in the sky. They don't sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet our God in heaven feeds them. Aren't you more important than they? Which of you by worrying can add a moment to your life-span? And why be anxious about clothing? Learn a lesson from the way the wild flowers grow. They don't work; they don't spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in full splendor was arrayed like one of these. If God can clothe in such splendor the grasses of the field, which bloom today and are thrown on the fire tomorrow, won't God do so much more for you - you who have so little faith?

Stop worrying, then, over questions such as, 'What are we to eat,' or 'what are we to drink,' or 'what are we to wear?' Those without faith are always running after these things. God knows everything you need. Seek first God's reign, and God's justice, and all these things will be given to you besides. Enough of worrying about tomorrow! Let tomorrow take care of itself. Today has troubles enough of its own.
