Ministry of Music:

Scripture: 1 John 3:16-24 (The Inclusive Bible: The First Egalitarian Translation)

(Let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action)

This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ died for us. And we, too, ought to lay down our lives for our sisters and brothers. If you have more than enough material possessions and see your neighbours in need yet close your hearts to them, how can the love of God be living in you?

My children, our love must not be simply words or mere talk - it must be true love, which shows itself in action and truth. This, then, is how we'll know we belong to the truth; this is how we'll be confident in God's presence, even if our consciences condemn us. We know that God is greater than our consciences and that God knows everything. And if our consciences do not condemn us, my friends, then we have confidence before God, and we will receive whatever we ask from God's hand - because we keep the commandments and do what is pleasing in God's sight.

The commandments are those that we believe in the name of God's Own, Jesus Christ, and that we love one another as we were told to do. Those who keep these commandments live in God and God lives in them. We know that God lives in us by the Spirit given to us.

Message: Love is a Verb

The command we heard in the reading from 1 John is clear - love one another.

God is love and our call as Christians is to love, to exercise our power in acts of love towards one another. Our multi-layered love for ourselves and others has God's love as its source and its model. Its essence, however, it to be expressed outwardly in action and - love is a verb. The power of God's love emboldens our acts of love in a world full of people who have been disempowered and ill-loved. The question for us is 'How can we, individually and as a community, enact our love in service to those who are in greatest need?'

The Social Justice Team at Melville is concerned about those people. So one Sunday each month we have been presenting information available in our local area about resources that are available. Today the focus is on mental health resources. A video has been prepared that offers valuable information that you or someone you know may appreciate.

Preparation for Prayer:

As we prepare our hearts and minds to enter into a time of prayer, I invite you to sit comfortably and quietly for a moment. Breathe deeply a few times paying particular attention to your breath as it moves in through your nostrils and fills your lungs. Picture your breath as a light entering your body and filling it with love and relaxation. Then when you exhale imagine the breath taking all your tensions and worries with it as it leaves your body. Do this a few times until you feel relaxed then move on into the prayer time.
