Greetings Members of Melville

Sharing an update on Council work and happenings around Melville.

In March, our minister Rev. Lynda Goy-Flint went on leave for health reasons. Her time on sick leave with Melville lasted for 6 months. On September 25, we received notice that Lynda was not well enough to return to work. At this time she went on Long Term Disability which is paid by an insurance company with the United Church of Canada. This allows Melville to have funds for extra ministry. As you know, we have had very capable supply ministers on Sunday mornings. Reverends Ruth Brown, Jeff Hawkins, Marion Loree, Felicia Urbanski and Tom Watson have filled our vacancies. In October, we employed Rev. Marion to assist with Pastoral Care and Rev. Felicia to help with the Social Justice and Outreach Team and Worship and Music Committee. Council is in the process of forming a Search Committee to see if there is a minister available for long term supply.

At the end of June, the Early Years program abruptly left. This was a decision of the Ontario Early Years. It is an unexpected loss of key rental income.





Music at Melville is being offered by Brad Halls on Wednesdays from noon until 1:00 pm. This is being attended by many who thoroughly enjoy the music. Please feel free to attend whenever you can and spread the news!

Granny's Attic Treasures was a very successful venture by the Fun, Funds & Fellowship and the UCW. On Friday and Saturday of October 27 and 28 baking, meat pies and many donated items were sold. The funds raised totaled over \$3300.00. Many people came to purchase and some saw our church building for the first time.

The Memory Angels will be presented in the sanctuary again this year. New Angels may be purchased through Lorna Bevcar or Patty Duncan. Donations for existing Angels are also being accepted.

A "Cozy Closet" was offered for the first time by the Social Justice & Outreach Team. The request for donations of new or gently used coats, boots, hats, etc. was generously met. These items were offered free to anyone in the community. The Closet was opened for two Saturdays, October 28 and November 4. Due to positive response, and additional donations, more dates are being planned.



Our Social Justice & Outreach Team is raising funds for Melville's Christmas Gift Program. Funds are used to sponsor as many children as possible under CW Food Bank's Christmas Angel Program. Melville has generously supported 8 children so far, across three families, and the team hopes to do more. To help spread joy to more children in our community, please consider donating. Envelopes are available at the back of the sanctuary or the church office. E-transfer is also an option.

The Centre Wellington Mobile Market is a nonprofit, volunteer run group that works to decrease food waste while fighting food insecurity in our region. On average, they support 60 households each week. They offer pop-up markets in high need neighborhoods throughout Centre Wellington, and meals are also delivered. Melville is supporting their good work by providing free weekly access to our kitchen until June 2024 In November, Elvis will have been in and out of the building for a show on the 18th. The Centre Wellington Singers will present their program of Christmas music on November 25th at 3:00 pm. Don Grant built new risers and refurbished the old ones for the performance.

The Trustees Committee under the leadership of Chairperson Neil Dunsmore has been very busy finalizing the deal with Eric Van Grootheest Holding Inc. and the property adjacent to our parking lot. Although the deal is not complete, it is well on its way. A part of the agreement is the paving of our parking lot at the expense of the realty company and approval of Melville. It is coming.
